WALL Makes Move to Give Back



The fall semester is quickly drawing to a close and registration for the spring semester will open on Monday, November 12. This is Veterans Day, a legal holiday, but you can still register on line. The spring

line-up comprises 17 courses. In order to be able to offer interesting courses, we pay an honorarium to our instructors. However, several instructors decline the honorarium, myself included. Several years ago, the Board of Directors of the Academy met with Dr. Vivia Fowler, then Provost and now Wesleyan President to negotiate the commission the Academy pays to Wesleyan College for hosting our program. At that time, we were paying the college 35% of our membership fees. To strengthen the financial position of the Academy the Board requested a reduction in the commission to 30% of the membership fees. In recognition of this the Board agreed to limit the number of courses for which honorariums are paid to 12 in the fall semester, which runs for only three months, and 16 in the spring semester, which runs for four months. This agreement can only be changed with the consent of a duly authorized college representative and a majority vote of the Academy Board of Directors. This agreement

We are now in a strong financial position and are able to give back to the college by offering a scholarship to a Wesleyan undergraduate, selected by the financial aid office. The establishment of this scholarship will not result in an increase in membership fees, or the reduction in the number of courses offered. Our intention is to provide an annual scholarship in the amount of \$1000, but this amount can be less, depending on WALL finances. The establishment of this scholarship requires an amendment to our bylaws, and members will be asked to vote on this amendment. The Holiday drop-in will serve as a general meeting for those able to attend. Members will receive an e-mail asking if they intend to attend the Drop-in. Voting forms will be available at that event. The drop-in will be held at the Porter House on Tucker Road. There is limited parking behind the Porter House, but additional parking is available in parking lot B, behind Porter Fine Arts Auditorium, refer to campus map and a golf cart will transport members to the Porter House.


Suggested Change to Bylaws

Establish A Scholarship Award

The proposed amendment to the By-laws authorizes the establishment of a need-based scholarship for a Wesleyan College undergraduate. Funds for the scholarship will be drawn from the WALL bank account held by the college. There will be no increase in membership fees or any reduction in the number of classes offered each semester. The Board of Directors of WALL urges members to approve the amendment.

(New) Article X: Annual Scholarship Award:

When sufficient funds are available, WALL shall provide a need-based scholarship to a Wesleyan College student who is selected by the Financial Aid office. The scholarship will be paid from the Fund balance held in the WALL bank account. The Finance Committee and the College Treasurer will determine when sufficient funds are available.
